Plaintiffs George Lindemann, Jr. and Marion Hulick,
having moved this Court for an extension of the temporary
restraining order entered in this action on April 12, 1995, and
scheduled to expire May 7, 1995,

NOW, upon the reading and filing of all of the
affidavits, exhibits, memoranda of law, and supplemental letters
submitted to date by the parties, as well as the arguments made
by counsel in open court on April 12, 1995 and May 5, 1995, it is
ORDERED, that the Temporary Restraining Order entered

on April 12, 1995, is continued until the Court issues its decision on plaintiffs' motion for a preliminary injunction, to the extent that plaintiffs may participate in and offer training assistance at the Old Salem Farm Horse Show in North Bedford, New York in May 1995, the Los Alamos Horse Show in Freehold, New Jersey on June 17, 1995, and the Lightfields Dressage Show in Whitehouse Station, New Jersey on June 18, 1995; and it is further

ORDERED that plaintiffs Lindemann and Hulick may not participate or offer any training assistance in any "protected competitions" as that term is defined by Article I, Section 2(G) of the Constitution of the United States Olympic Committee; and it is further

ORDERED that with respect to the Dressage at Saratoga Horse Show on May 27-29, 1995, the plaintiffs may participate or offer training assistance solely in the "non-protected" classes of such Show (i.e., classes other than those designated as  "CDI" or "CDI-W"); and it is further

ORDERED that with respect to the Miller's/USET National Grand Prix Dressage Championships at Gladstone, New Jersey on June 22-25, 1995, the plaintiffs may participate or offer training assistance solely in the "non-protected" classes of such Show (i.e., classes other than those designated as  "Grand Prix" or "Grand Prix Special") of such Show; and it is further

ORDERED that plaintiffs may pursue such complaint procedures as may be required or available under Article IX of the Constitution of the United States Olympic Committee with

respect to their ability to participate in or offer training assistance in "protected competitions" without prejudice to or waiving their claim that this Court has jurisdiction entirely to vacate plaintiffs' suspensions.
