Its mission is to be a premier speed skating organization in the world through excellence in leadership, development and performance. To date, US Speedskating has won 88 Olympic medals, making it the most successful winter sport in the U.S. In addition to its elite programs, US Speedskating is responsible for the grassroots development of speed skating.

USS SafeSport

The US Speedskating SafeSport Policy establishes a healthy, positive and safe environment for all parties participating in the sport of speed skating. The USS SafeSport Policy raises awareness about misconduct in sport, promotes open dialogue, provides training and resources, and assists members with potential allegations.

USS works in partnership with the U.S. Center for SafeSport to prevent abuse and foster a national sport culture of respect and safety on and off the ice. The U.S. Center of SafeSport has exclusive authority within speed skating to investigate and resolve allegations of sexual misconduct and any related misconduct.

The following groups are required to complete Safesport training: elected members of the USS Board of Directors, Staff, Certified Coaches, Level 3, 4 & 5 Officials, and USS contractors that have regular contact with athletes. It is required that all USS Athletes listed in the USADA pool take this training.

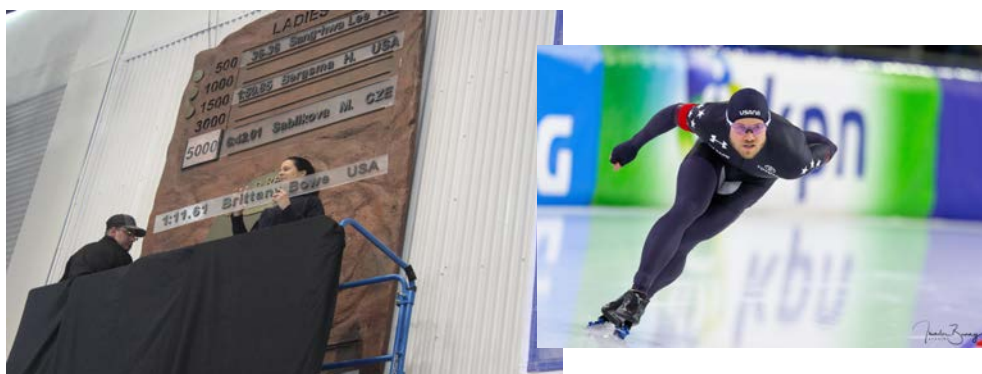

US SPEEDSKATING 2018-19 YEAR IN REVIEW

World Junior Speed Skating Championships

The ten members of the U.S. Junior Long Track World team finished competition Sunday at the 2019 World Junior Championships at the Stadio Del Ghiaccio in Baselga di Pine, Italy. With some personal bests and a few top 15 finishes, it was a successful event for the young Team USA squad. **Austin Kleba** placed 6th in the 1000m and **Ethan Cepuran** finished 6th in the 5000m.

World Junior Short Track Speed Skating Championships

Maame Biney defended her 500m junior world title and set a junior world record at the World Junior Short Track Championships in Montreal, Canada. Maame also finished 9th overall in the 1000m. **Corinne Stoddard** won her 500m B Final and finished 11th overall in the 1000m and 20th overall in the 1500m.

2019 World Sprint/Allround Championships

Olympian Brittany Bowe won overall bronze at the World Sprint Championships and . **Ethan Cepuran** and **Carlijn Schoutens** raced in three distances each, finishing 24th and 22nd overall, respectively, at the World Allround Championships.

2019 World Short Track Championships

Held in Sofia, Bulgaria, the World Short Track Championships featured the top U.S. short track skaters including **Kristen Santos** who reached the B Finals in the Ladies 1500m. **Aaron Tran** reached the 1500m semifinals, but did not advance.



Junior Skater Recognition

All short and long track skaters receive a letter of congratulations at the end of their final Junior season from USS and are recognized at the Long Track AmCup Final and Short Track Age Group Nationals.

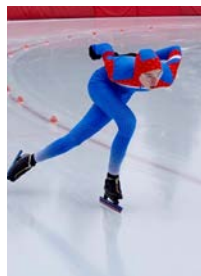

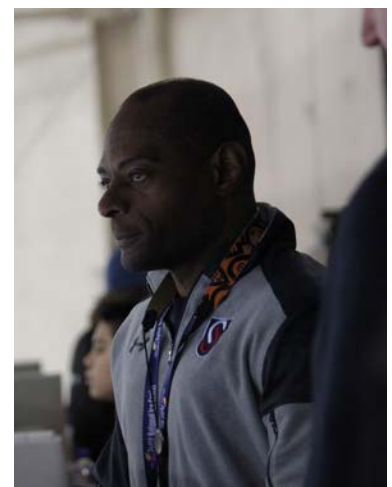

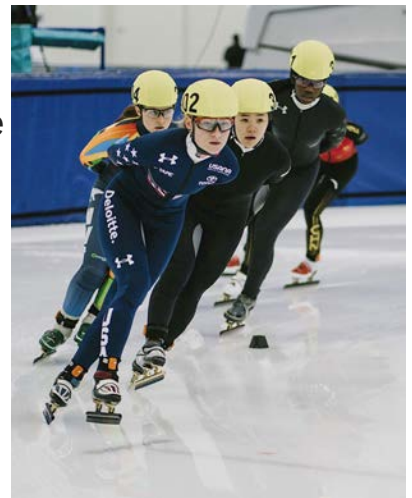

Unlike many rival nations, there is no government funding to support U.S. athletes. USS' primary sources of funding are U.S. Olympic Committee high performance grants, sponsorships and fundraising – with the spirit of Olympism motivating the American public to give privately and help athletes accomplish their goals.

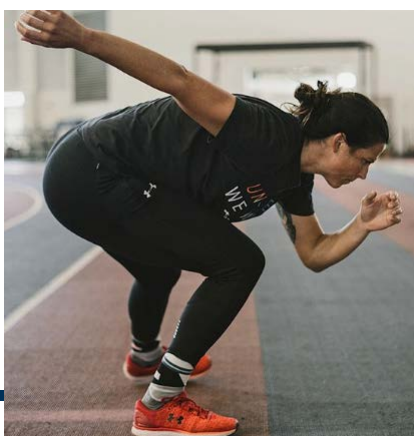

- Organizational financial stability with six years of net operating income, increasing net assets from a negative \$788,000 in 2013 to positive \$525,605 in 2019.
- Positive financial results through sound planning and execution, while dedicating resources to athletic programs
- Effective fundraising programs, including an endowment campaign to increase the US Speedskating Foundation (known traditionally as the USISA Charitable Fund) funds that support US Speedskating
- Long-term relationships to maximize future funding opportunities through sponsors, private donors and fundraising events
- Capitalized on fundraising opportunities created by the Olympic Games and World Championship events
- Significant contributions in products and services through value in kind sponsor relationships, creating positive results on cash positions while maximizing support for athletic programs
- Strong governance and fiscal leadership from USS Board of Directors
- Empowerment and effective oversight of professional staff with a value-driven philosophy (integrity, accountability, team)
- Invested in a major capital outlay in the new state-of-the-art training facility with no debt

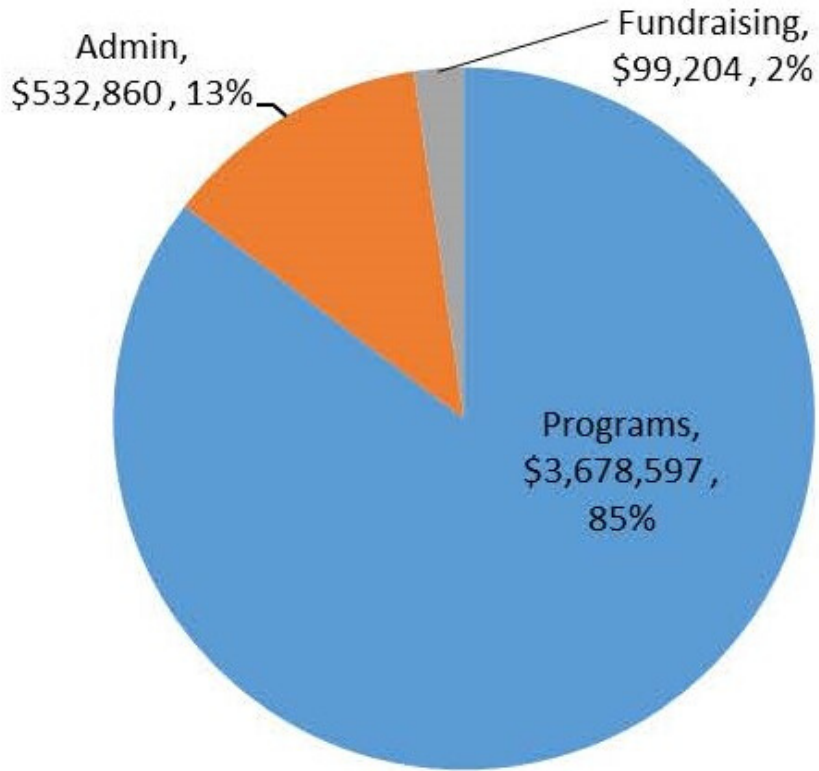

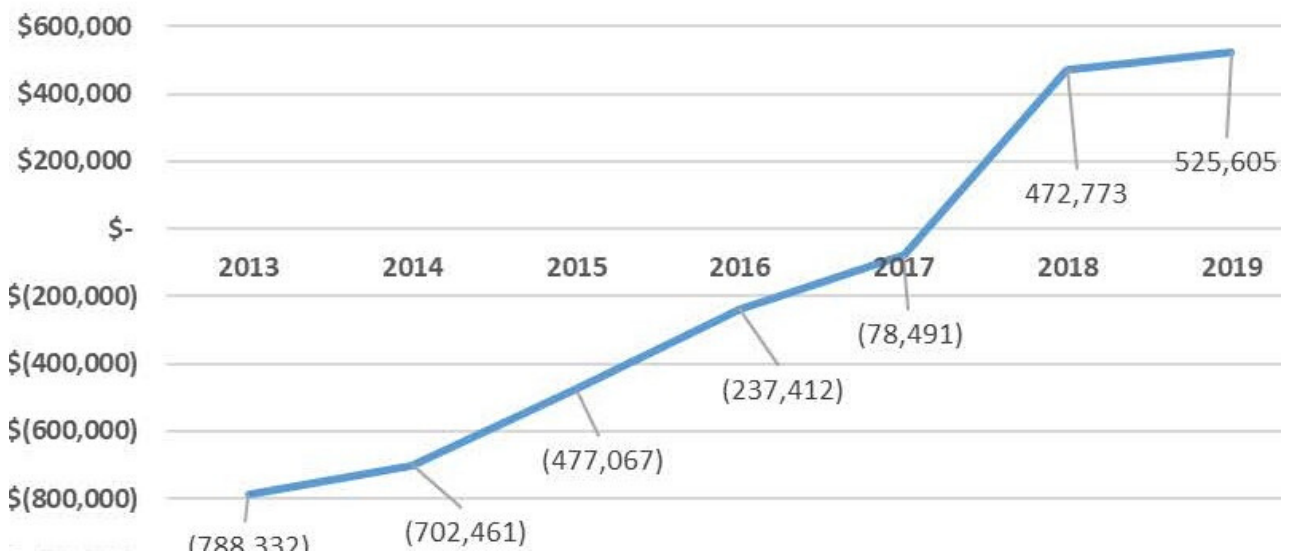

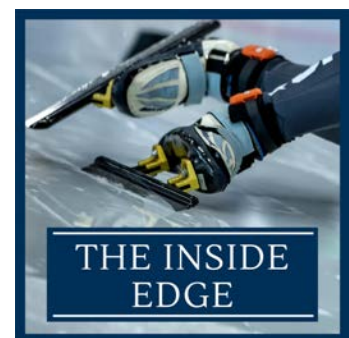
