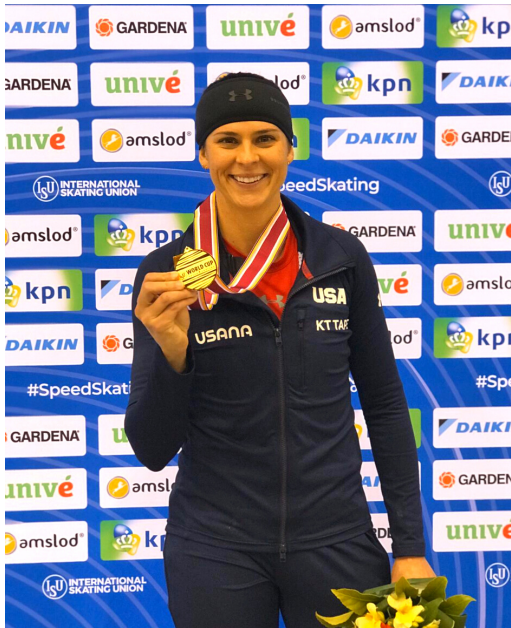

Representing the fastest human-powered sport in the world, US Speedskating (USS) is a non-profit organization recognized by the United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee (USOPC) and the International Skating Union (ISU) as the governing body for the sport of speed skating in the United States.

USS MISSION

Its mission is to be a premier speed skating organization in the world through excellence in leadership, development and performance. To date, USS has won 88 Olympic medals, making it the most successful winter sport in the United States. In addition to its elite programs, USS is responsible for the grassroots development of speed skating.

2019 USS CYCLING EXPERIENCE

Twenty-four cycling enthusiasts enjoyed the fifth annual US Speedskating Cycling Experience, June 21-23, 2019 in Boulder, Colorado. This event supports the USS National Team athletes as they make their journey toward the 2022 Olympic Winter Games in Beijing.



USS SAFESPORT

The US Speedskating SafeSport Policy establishes a healthy, positive and safe environment for all parties participating in the sport of speed skating. The USS SafeSport Policy raises awareness about misconduct in sport, promotes open dialogue, provides training and resources, and assists members with potential allegations.

USS works in partnership with the U.S. Center for SafeSport to prevent abuse and foster a national sport culture of respect and safety on and off the ice. The U.S. Center of SafeSport has exclusive authority within speed skating to investigate and resolve allegations of sexual misconduct and any related misconduct.

The following groups are required to complete SafeSport training; elected members of the USS Board of Directors, Staff, Certified Coaches, Level 3, 4 & 5 Officials, USS contractors that have frequent or regular contact with athletes, all USS members that have a 1st Year, Club Competitor/Recreational, or National-Level Competitor membership and that are 18 years of age or older. It is recommended that all USS Athletes listed in the USADA pool take this training, but it is not required.

WORLD CUP FINAL

The 2019-2020 ISU Long Track season concluded on March 8, 2020 with two U.S. athletes bringing home medals from the World Cup Finals at Thialf Stadium in Heerenveen, Netherlands. Two-time Olympian and Olympic medalist **Brittany Bowe** won the silver medal in the 1000m and also won her fourth overall World Cup 1000m title. Two-time Olympian **Joey Mantia** earned bronze in the Mass Start and also finished the season in second place overall in the Mass Start event.

JUNIOR WORLD LONG TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Junior World Championships were held at the Arena Lodowa in Tomaszów Mazowiecki, Poland February 21-23, 2020. **Casey Dawson** captured the bronze medal in the Men's 5000m which topped off a weekend of great performances by Team USA.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this event was cancelled.

JUNIOR WORLD SHORT TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Junior World Short Track Championships were held in Bormio, Italy January 31 - February 2, 2020 where **Corinne Stoddard** of USS lead the way for the team. Stoddard earned a bronze medal in the 500m and followed up with a silver in the 1000m event. She also was the only athlete to make the finals in all three individual events.



YOUTH OLYMPIC GAMES

The 2020 Youth Olympic Games came to a close on January 22, where five USS athletes enjoyed numerous successes on an international level. Long Tracker **Jonathan Tobon** earned a bronze medal in the Men's 1500m; Tobon also anchored his Mixed NOC Team Sprint team, skating to another bronze medal. Short Tracker **Jonathan So** was a part of the gold medal-winning Mixed Short Track - NOC Relay team.

2019-2020 HOSTED MAJOR EVENTS

2019-2020 SHORT TRACK WORLD CUP #1: NOVEMBER 1-3

The ISU Short Track World Cup season kicked off in Salt Lake City where 35 new National Records and one World Record were set.

- Utah Olympic Oval: 3,600 in attendance
- Kim Boutin set a world record in the Ladies 500m
- Kristen Santos set a U.S. National Record in the Ladies 1000m
- On Facebook there was over 150,000 impressions and over 370,000 people reached
- Almost 5,000 people came out to the event

2020 LONG TRACK FOUR CONTINENTS CHAMPIONSHIPS: JANUARY 31 - FEBRUARY 2

The inaugural ISU Four Continents Speed Skating Championships event was held at the Pettit National Ice Center.

- Mia Kilburg won two individual gold medals: Ladies 3000m and Mass Start, and a bronze in the 1000m
- Brianna Bocox won two individual gold medals: Ladies 1500m and 1000m
- Kilburg, Bocox and Paige Schwartzburg won gold in the Ladies Team Pursuit

2020 LONG TRACK WORLD SINGLE DISTANCES CHAMPIONSHIPS: FEBRUARY 13-16

For the first time in 13 years, the ISU World Single Distances Championships made its way back to the Utah Olympic Oval. The U.S. athletes made incredible strides and made use of their time on the Fastest Ice On Earth. 6 World Records were set over the four day event.

- Utah Olympic Oval: 7,000+ in attendance
- Two-time Olympian Joey Mantia won bronze in the Men's 1500m
- Kimi Goetz had two top-5 finishes
- Team USA finished with 9 top 8 finishes

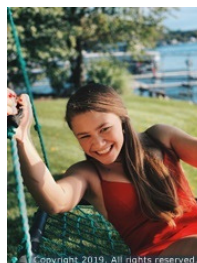

USS 2019-2020 FINANCIAL REPORT

US Speedskating's funding of athletic programs makes a difference in the dreams of Olympic skaters, from pond to podium. Unlike many rival nations, there is no government funding to support U.S. athletes. USS' primary sources of funding are USOPC high performance grants, ISU Event & Development grants, sponsorships and fundraising – with the spirit of Olympism motivating the American public to give privately and help athletes accomplish their goals.

- Invested in a major capital outlay in the new state-of-the-art training facility with no debt

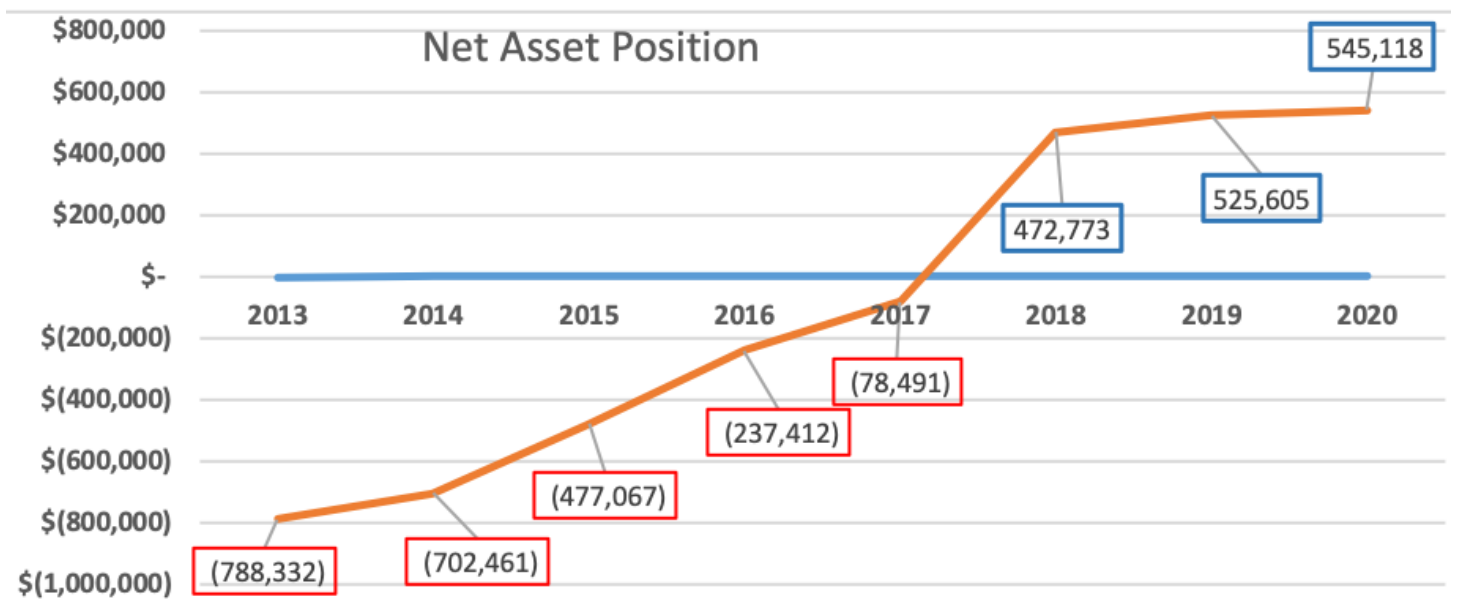
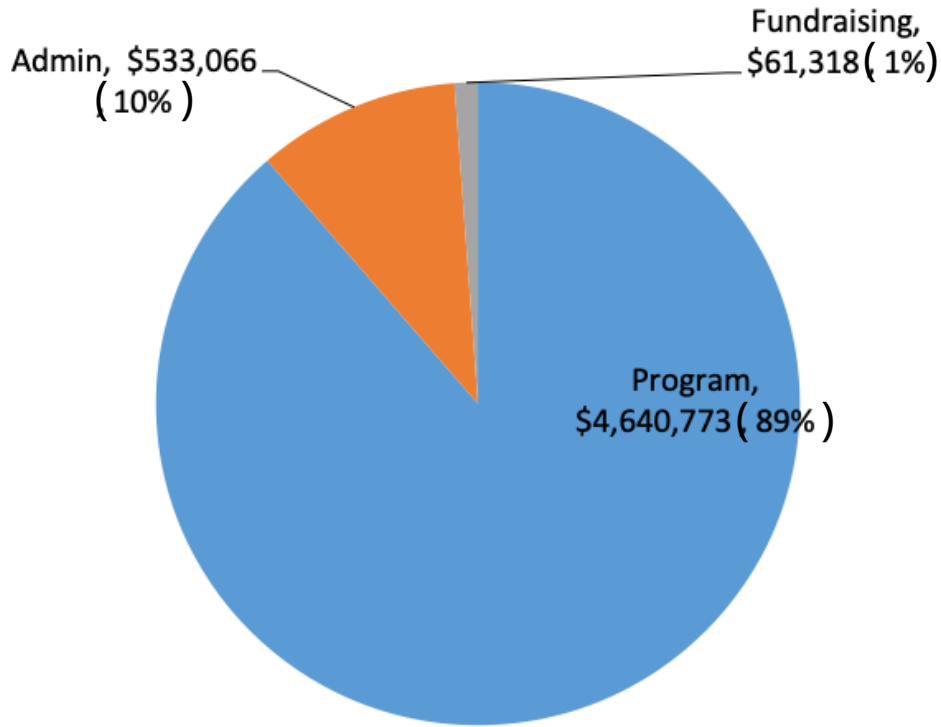
