



Casting Racquetball Video Content to Your TV

The following guide is a complete walkthrough to assist racquetball fans in casting their favorite racquetball video content and footage to their personal TVs. Here are two easy ways to cast video footage to your TV.

Additional Needs: Must have a Google Account and the Google Home App downloaded on Smartphone

Google's 3rd generation Chromecast is effectively the most versatile and user-friendly casting device on the market. **Click the link above to take you directly to the product.** It plugs into an HDMI port and exists as an ambient environment ready to cast anything your phone has available to play. Once you switch your TV to the correct HDMI input, you will see the Chromecast environment displaying the Time, Weather, WiFi name currently connected, and a cycle of Google-picked photos (can be adjusted to cycle through Facebook gallery photos if desired). This device is capable of casting Netflix, Facebook videos, YouTube videos, Disney+, Hulu, Spotify, and much more with one click.

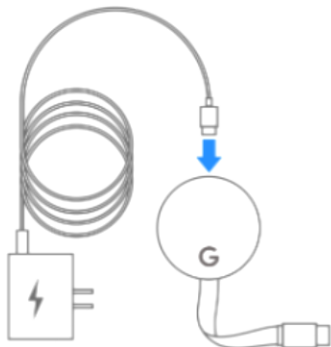

Plug in your Chromecast device.

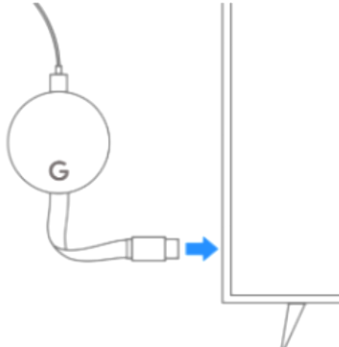

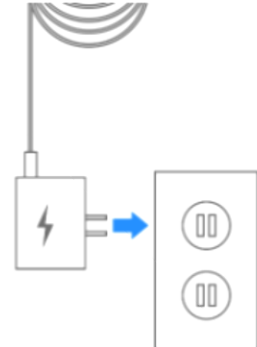
Plug the included USB power cable into your Chromecast.

2



Plug your Chromecast into any open HDMI port on your TV.

3



Plug the power supply into an open outlet.

Then, make sure your TV is on the correct HDMI Input.

Now, you should see the Chromecast Welcome screen.

If you don't see this screen, press the Input or Source button on your display's remote control until the screen appears.

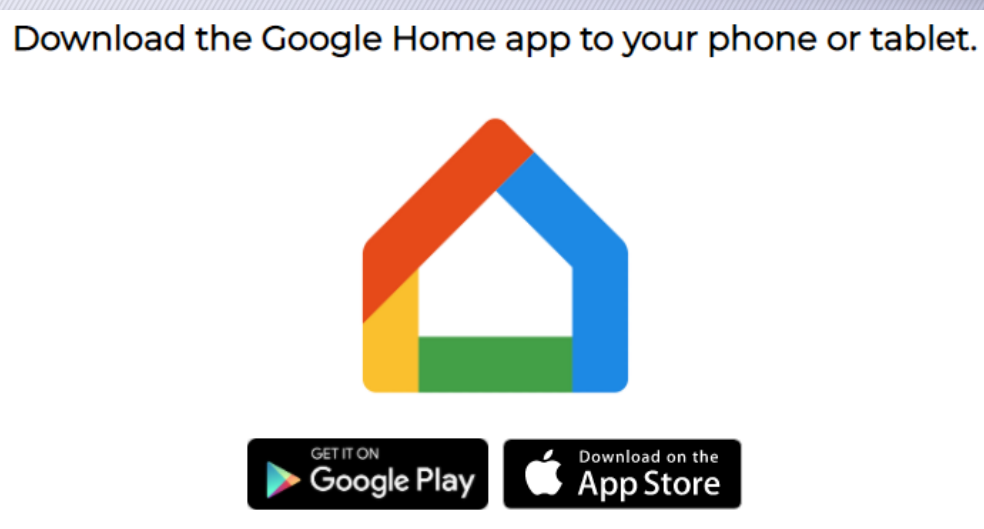


Make note of the Chromecast device number on your TV screen for later.

You will need to download the most recent version of the Google Home app on your smart phone or tablet. This app is easily accessible from the Android or Apple stores.

Follow the prompts on your smartphone or tablet.

Open the Google Home app and follow the prompts.
Make sure your Bluetooth is turned on.




Choose a Google account to connect to. Choose a home, or create a new one.

Once your app is looking for devices, continue to the next step.

You will be able to see an identical code on both your device and your TV.

Follow the prompts to connect your Chromecast.
Make sure your Bluetooth is turned on.



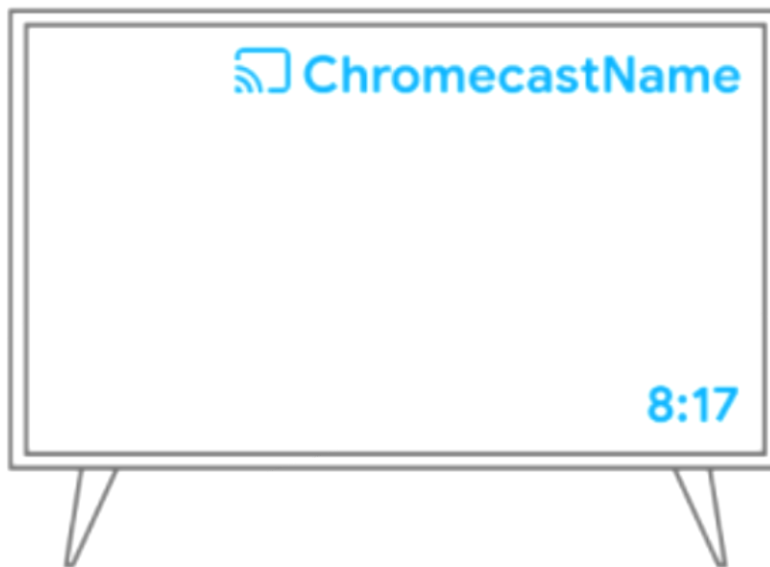
Choose the device with the same number from the Welcome screen. Confirm the number on the screen.

When you see "Choose your Wi-Fi network," continue to the next step.

You should see a background image, the time, and your device's name.

That's it! You are ready to cast your favorite footage anytime you would like. Once you have a video pulled up that you wish to watch on your TV, look for the icon below and click on the name of the Chromecast device you just set up!

Fire TV Stick with Alexa Built-In

Time to Set-Up: 5 minutes

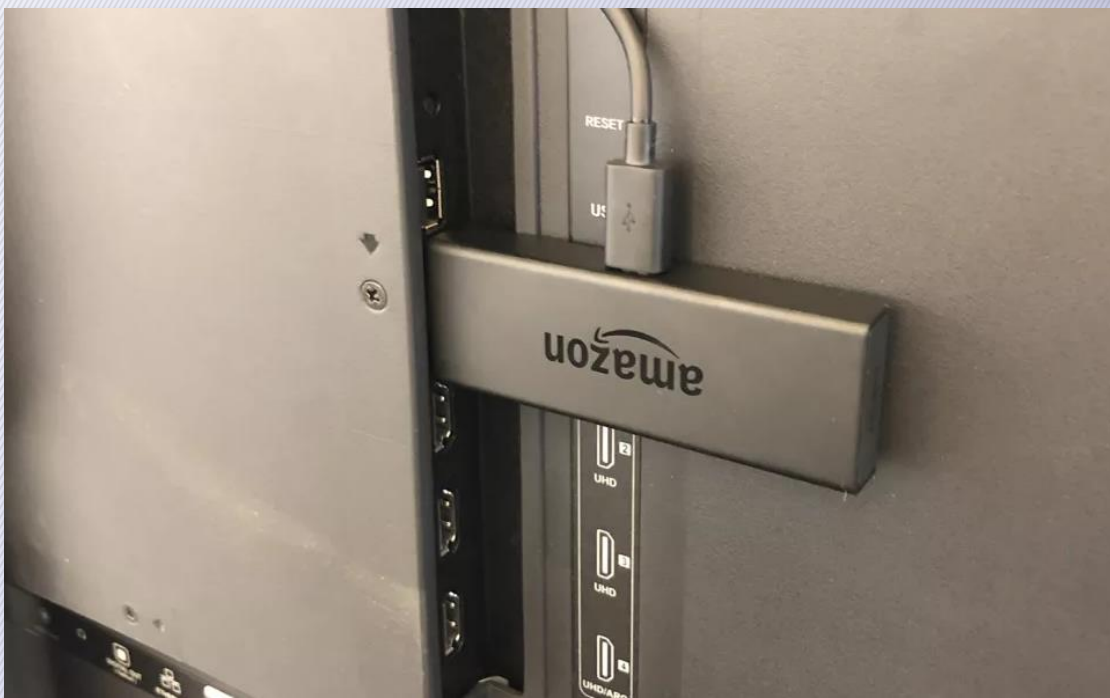
Additional Needs: Must have a Prime Account for access to Prime Video content. If you wish to watch Facebook videos, you need Facebook Watch App downloaded.

The Fire TV Stick is the best “media stick” on the current market. The difference between the Chromecast and a Media Stick is the controls and the housing of the media. With the Media Stick, there is no need to use your phone to watch anything. All your favorites from Netflix, YouTube, Prime Video, Disney+, Apple TV, HBO, and more are all preloaded on the Media Stick and can be accessed anytime you like. This version of the Fire TV Stick also offers built-in Alexa for easier controls. If there are videos and such that you wish to watch on Facebook, you need to download the Facebook Watch App onto your Fire TV Stick.

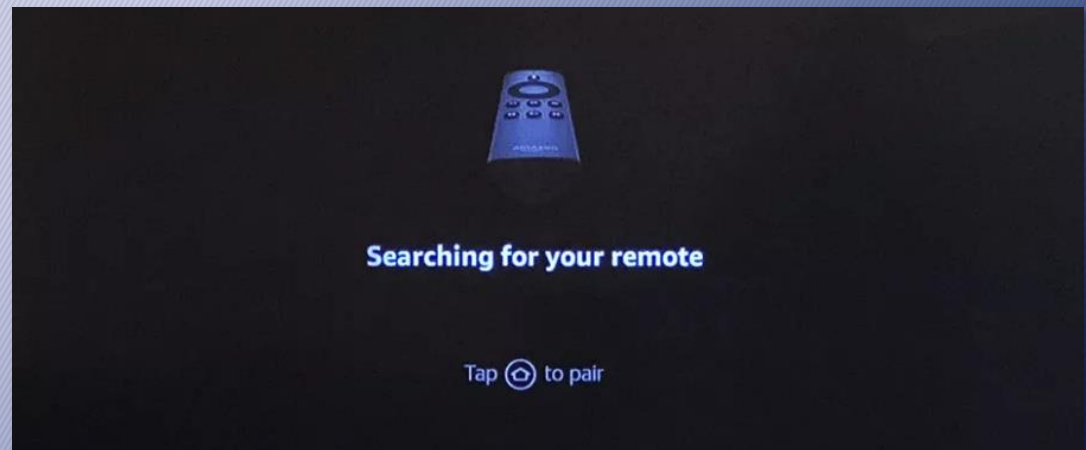

Like the Chromecast steps, plug the stick into power and into the HDMI port on your TV.

You then need to pair your remote by pressing Home in the remote.



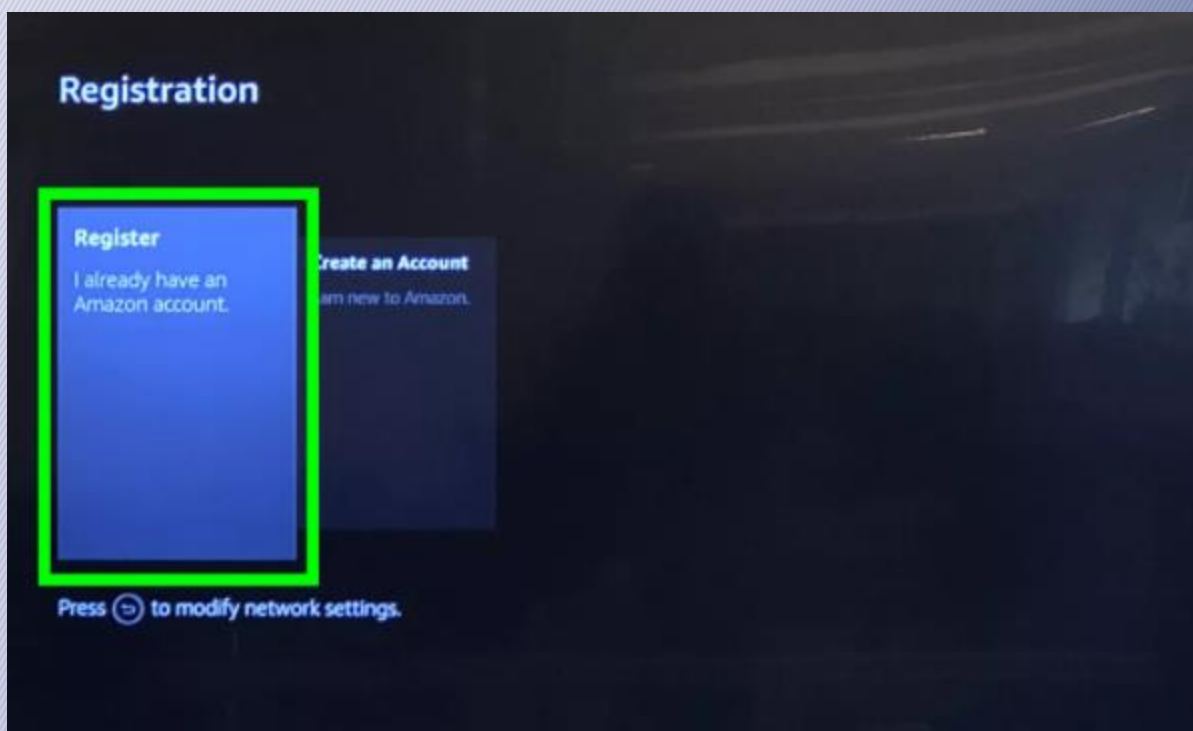

Select the desired language as well as your WiFi network login information. This will connect the Fire TV Stick to your home network.

After the device is connected, login and authenticate your Amazon Account Information.



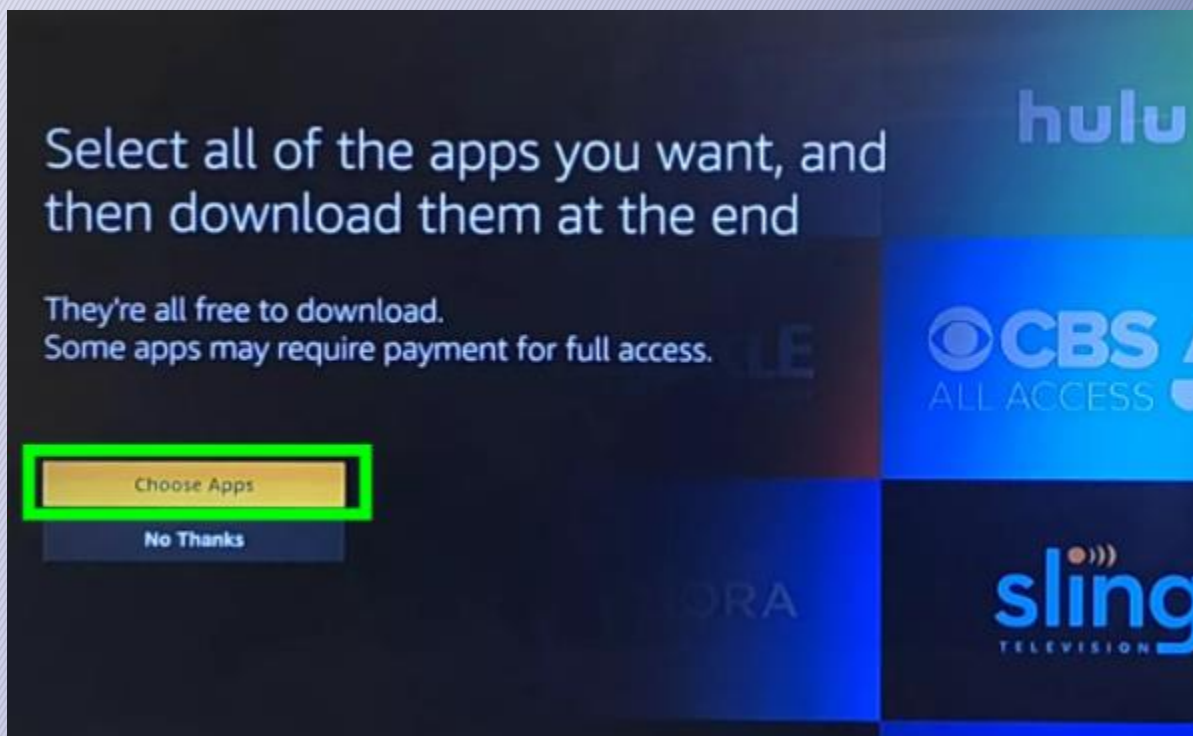

After answering a few more questions, you will be prompted to download all the typical apps you wish to use frequently. This should also include Facebook Watch if you have video content you wish to watch from Facebook on your TV. You do not have to login to your Facebook account to watch.

Please note that the Fire TV Stick uses significantly more latent bandwidth than Google Chromecast as it is always on and available.
